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

A LETTER FROM COLLABORACTION'S MANAGING DIRECTOR DR. MARCUS ROBINSON:

Now, more than ever, we are called to reclaim the meaning of America. Today, we need to reimagine Chicago as a "shining city on a hill" where are all are welcome even those who are tired, poor, wretched, yet humbly wanting a chance to be free. I'm really starting to love the label "liberal." For me it means being free to pursue my self-interest in alignment with the greater good where the needs of the many outweigh the needs a few. To live free, unencumbered by the oppressions of the most powerful, the most rich, and the most connected. If we are to realize this idea, liberal and progressive folk need to do our own work to insure that we are able to press into the ending racism, gender oppression, and inequity in our community.

A Blue Island in the Red Sea gives all of us a chance to reflect on our shared history of oppression in the US. Chicago in particular. It gives the audience and artist a chance to come to grips with the roots of racism, sexism, and identity oppression that has segregated our city and lingers as the root cause of violence, uneven educational opportunities, and the woeful lack of economic empowerment in disinvested neighborhoods. Not only do we get the insight gleaned from a theatrical production, we get to reflect as a community and pull learnings through dialogue. The play, combined with it's community dialogue session, invites honest inquiry that generates empathy and a desire to help make things better.

We are grateful for the opportunity to create incredible theatre experiences like *A Blue Island in the Red Sea* as our contribution to a movement to create peace, cure racism, and cultivate a shared sense of belonging to each other in Chicago.

In 2013, he co-devised and directed Crime Scene: a Chicago Anthology, a docudrama about the root causes of violence in Chicago, which drew on over 250 sources. The show and its subsequent four sequels toured Chicago for three years. In its 125 performances. it reached over 25,000 Chicagoans. Each performance also featured dance battle tournaments, free meals and Originally from the North-West a town hall discussion. Anthony then initiated Collaboraction's annual *Peacebook* festival, a collection of 24 world premiere pieces featuring over 235 artists. which premieres at the Goodman Theatre each year before touring the city. In 2014, he co-wrote, co-directed and acted in This is Not a Cure For Cancer, an existential dramedy inspired by his father's battle with cancer. He wrote and directed Connected, a show exploring our relationship with technology. Anthony is also a collaborative partner with his wife and soul-mate. Chicago artist Sandra Delgado.
